Listen and Appraise	Knowledge	- To know five songs by heart.							
		- To know some songs have a chorus or a response/answer part.							
		- To know that songs have a musical style.							
	Skills	- To learn how they can enjoy moving to music by dancing, marching, being animals or pop stars.							
		- To learn how songs can tell a story or describe an idea.							
	Knowledge	- To know that music has a steady pulse, like a heartbeat.							
		- To know that we can create rhythms from words, our names, favourite foods, colours and animals.							
Musical		- Rhythms are different from the steady pulse.

Games		develop the following skills in relation to a main song: - Find the pulse.							
		- Listen to the rhythm and clap back short rhythmic phrases based on words, with one and two syllables whilst marching							
		to the steady beat.							



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		- Create rhythms for others to copy.			
		- Listen and use voices to sing back vocal warm ups at different pitches whilst marching to the steady beat.			
Musical Activities: Singing	Knowledge	- To confidently know and sing five songs from memory.			
		- To know that unison is everyone singing at the same time.			
		- Songs include other ways of using the voice e.g. rapping (spoken word).			
		- To know why we need to warm up our voices.			
	Skills	- Learn about voices, singing notes of different pitches (high and low).			
		- Learn that they can make different types of sounds with their voices – you can rap or say words in rhythm.			
		- Learn to start and stop singing when following a leader.			
		- Learn to find a comfortable singing position.			
Musical Activities: Playing Instruments	Knowledge	- Learn the names of the notes in their instrumental part from memory or when written down.			
		- Know the names of untuned percussion instruments played in class.			
	Skills	- Treat instruments carefully and with respect.			
		- Learn to play an instrumental part that matches their musical challenge, using one of the differentiated parts (a one-			
		note part, a simple part, medium part).			
		- Play the part in time with the steady pulse.			
		- Listen to and follow musical instructions from a leader.			
Musical Activities: Improvisation	Knowledge	- Improvisation is about making up your own tunes on the spot.			
		- When someone improvises, they make up their own tune that has never been heard before. It is not written down and			
		belongs to them.			
		- Everyone can improvise, and you can use one or two notes.			
	Skills	Learn to improvise in different ways:			
		- Listen and clap back, then listen and clap their own answer (rhythms of words).			
		- Use their voices and instruments, listen and sing back, then listen and play their own answer using one or two notes.			
		- Take it in turns to improvise using one or two notes.			
Musical Activities: Composition	Knowledge	- Composing is like writing a story with music.			
		- Everyone can compose.			
	Skills	- Help create simple melodies with the units using one, three or five different notes.			
		- Learn how the notes of the composition can be written down and changed if necessary.			
	Knowledge	- A performance is sharing music with other people, called an audience.			



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		- A performance can be a special occasion and involve a class, a year group or a whole school.			
Musical		- An audience can include your parents and friends.			
Activities:	Skills	- Choose a song they have learnt from the scheme and perform it.			
Performance		- They can add their ideas to the performance.			
		- Record the performance and say how they were feeling about it.
