




World Events - Remembrance

- Remembrance Day is a day to remember people who have suffered and died in wars. This is held on the 11th November each year.
- The 11th November 1918 was called Armistice Day as World War I ended on that day at 11am.
- Paper poppies are worn to remind us of the real poppies that grew in the battlefields of the First World War.
- After the war, people built special memorials to remember the soldiers who had fought and died. These are called cenotaphs. There is a cenotaph in Failsworth.
