## What sort of jobs do people do at the seaside?

Liahthouse keeper – a person who looks after a lighthouse.

Lifeguards – people who are specially trained to rescue people who get into trouble on the beach or in the sea.

Fishermen – sailors who catch and sell seafood for a living.

## When did seaside holidays become popular?

Seaside holidays became popular during Victorian times (1900s). This was partly because of the invention of the steam train which allowed tourists to travel and visit the coast more easily.





There are 4 main seas surrounding the UK.

- The **English Channel** off the southern coast between England and France.
- The Irish Sea between Northern England, Wales and Ireland.
- The **North Sea** between England and the Netherlands.
- The **Celtic Sea** south of Ireland.
