


<b>mouth</b>	The place where a river enters a lake, sea or ocean.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Know and explain why many cities are situated on rivers.</li> </ul>

<b>channel</b>	A wide strait or waterway between two pieces of land.			
<b>tributary</b>	A stream or river that flows into a larger stream, river or lake.			
<b>flood plain</b>	An area of flat land alongside a river.			
<b>erosion</b>	The process by which natural materials are worn away and transported by wind or water.			
<b>confluence</b>	Where two or more rivers join together to form a single channel.			
<b>flood management</b>	To control the flow of a river in order to reduce the risk of flooding.
