Subject Specific Vocabulary

Europe	a continent in the northern hemisphere
capital city	the city within a country where the government is based, often the largest city in a country
latitude	horizontal lines showing the distance north and south from the equator
longitude	vertical lines showing the distance east and west
equator	an imaginary line around the middle of the earth splitting it into northern and southern hemispheres
northern hemisphere	the part of earth that is north of the equator
economic activity	the process of making goods or providing a service.
trade links	buying and selling goods between 2 or more countries.
natural resources	anything found in nature that can be used by a living thing
tourism	people travelling to other countries or cities for a holiday
employment	to have a job that you get paid for
transport	taking goods or people from one place to another
climate zones	an area that has its own distinct climate
